- 3. In what sense is the Gospel of Jesus Christ truly the "cure" for racism? Try to be specific...
- 4. Of the six major points highlighted in the weekend message, which one(s) felt the most practical or meaningful for you and why?
 - Acknowledging blind spots
 - Renaming others as "brothers and sisters"
 - Giving "in group" love to your "out groups"
 - Acknowledging each other's color
 - Be a listener and not just a talker
 - Trusting our hearts with those "not like us"
- 5. Did the illustration of "right privilege" (righties experiencing the world a little differently than lefties) make sense to you in terms of acknowledging blind spots? If so, how did the idea specifically speak to you? Discuss...
