QUESTIONS FOR LIFE GROUPS AND PERSONAL REFLECTION

Personal Life:

- 1. As Pastor Jeremy shared three major reflections about his first 50 years of life, did it cause you to reflect on your own spiritual journey so far? If so, what is one major thing God has etched into your own life that you've been able to encourage or share with others? Discuss...
- 2. Ponderings:

- 3. In Hebrews 13:5 we read of God's promise never to leave us for forsake us as His children. Why is it so critically important for us to live every day with the assurance of our salvation based on the promise of God alone? Discuss...
- 4. In Luke 7, Jesus tells a story about how a person who understands the depth of God's forgiveness begins to love others more deeply. In what way(s) has this been true in your own life? Try to be as specific as possible...
- 5. In 2 Timothy 2:13, Paul tells this young church leader, "...even if we are faithless, (God) remains faithful, for He cannot disown Himself." Why is the unconditionality of God's New Covenant with us so powerful? How often do you meditate upon God's faithfulness to you? Discuss...

Promptings:

6. As God's children, we've been redeemed and continue to live in the midst of an ongoing story of redemption. Is there an issue, struggle or relationship in your life that you're trusting God to redeem or restore? If you haven't done so already, would you commit to inviting someone you feel safe with to participate in that redemption story with you through prayer, counsel and transparency? Discuss...
