Three Incomparable Encouragements from the Holy Spirit in Us:

1. The certain promise of _____ (vs. 18-21)

- This earth is NOT Heaven (see 2 Corinthians 11:23-31)

2. The confident power of _____ (vs. 22-25)

- God is molding us into the image of Christ – total dependence on the Father

- There is nothing as effective as suffering in getting us there
- 3. The constant presence of _____ (vs. 26-27)
 - God answers our prayers in one of three ways: Yes, No or Wait
 - In the midst of "No" or "Wait" God remains faithful as our Helper

Life Application:

Can there be meaning, purpose and even *blessing* in suffering? Only the follower of Jesus can answer "yes." And during the darkest night of the soul, the Holy Spirit is there to comfort and teach us dependence upon His power and presence...
